Minutes:

- **1. Call to Order.** Chair Valline called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m.
- **2. Roll Call.** Jensen took roll call. Members present: Grace Garrett, Steve Green, Ron Kohn, Todd Maher (zoom), Susan Miller, Charlie Parkhurst, Jenna Ramsey (zoom), Donna Robinson, Susan Shepherd, John Straight, Sherman Struble, and Todd Valline. Alternates present: Brian Bills. Staff members present: John McCurdy, Erin Hudson, Mark Lander, Rhonda Brown, Karen Mauer, and Mindy Jensen. Others Present: Tracee Knapp for Congressman Nunn.
- **3. Discuss/Approve Agenda.** Valline discussed that the agenda should be amended to add to #9 the wording that this is resolution 2023-1. Parkhurst moved to approve the agenda; Shepherd seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- **4. Discuss/Approve Minutes February 23, 2023.** Robinson moved to approve the minutes. Struble seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- **5. Financial Report.** Brown presented the financial report for December. Brown presented the financial report for January and February for information purposes only because not all payroll information is available due to the change to the Proliant payroll system and members discussed. Parkhurst moved to approve the December financial report; Garrett seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- **6. Payment of Bills.** Brown presented payment of bills and members discussed. Struble moved to approve the payment of bills; Green seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- **11. Agency Expenditures.** Lander presented a proposal to purchase 2 used transit buses and requested spending authority of \$100,000 to purchase these buses. Lander shared that new buses are not being manufactured at a rate sufficient to fulfill our current grant awards in a timely manner, so SWITA needs to add vehicles to its fleet by purchasing some quality used vehicles. Struble moved to approve the spending authority of \$100,000 to purchase 2 used transit buses; Parkhurst seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- **12.** Discuss/Set Public Hearing date and time for FY24 lowa DOT Consolidated Funding **Application.** Robinson moved to approve setting the public hearing date and time for FY24 lowa DOT Consolidated Funding for April 27, 2023, at 1:30pm; Struble seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- 9. Discuss/Approve Resolution 2023-1 to remove Alexsis Fleener from SWIPCO signature authority and add Erin Hudson, Community Development Director to signature authority for bank accounts. Parkhurst moved to approve Resolution 2023-1; Struble seconded. The motion passed with all ayes. Valline, Board Chairman, and Struble, Board Secretary, signed resolution.
- **10. Discuss/Approve Executive Director Annual Compensation.** Valline presented that the board met on March 22, 2023, to discuss. Valline reported that the board recommended an annual compensation increase of 7.5%. Green moved to approve the Executive Director Annual Compensation 7.5% increase; Garrett seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.
- **11. Discuss/Approve Driver Weather Leave Policy Change.** McCurdy presented the change to employee handbook severe weather or other emergencies policy that would stay the same for office staff, but full-time drivers shall be allocated 16 hours of severe weather/emergency leave on January 1 of each

year. Green moved to approve the Driver Weather Leave Policy Change; Struble seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.

- **12. Annual board member code of conduct acknowledgement.** McCurdy presented the SWIPCO Code of Conduct policy and asked that all board members sign acknowledgement. McCurdy asked that the members not present in person today get this document signed and returned prior to the next meeting.
- **13. Transit Report.** Lander reported the estimated numbers for February: Rides 39,000; Miles 165,000; Hours 9,800. These numbers do not include FWD numbers. Lander reported that these are good numbers for the month and that GRC numbers stayed about the same. Lander shared that ridership statewide has decreased since Covid, but SWITA continues to increase. Lander shared that this increase is due to increased work routes and the FWD program.
- **14. Planning Report.** Hudson presented a full project list and discussed projects that are up and running right now. See attached project list.
- **15. Housing and Southwest Iowa Housing Trust Fund Report.** Hudson presented. See attached Housing and Housing Trust Fund Report.
- **16. Business RLF Report.** McCurdy presented and shared that he has been contacted by a couple small businesses potentially looking to submit a business plan and application. McCurdy shared that BNK Trucking is still working on selling their trucks.
- 17. Director's Report. McCurdy presented and shared that this will be his tenth year as Executive Director at SWIPCO. McCurdy shared that he met with Essex, Red Oak, and Griswold recently. McCurdy also discussed that he was in DC last week for congressional delegation. McCurdy also shared that he presented and answered questions at the Pacific Islander Community Townhall Meeting at the community building that was put together by public health.

EXPENDITURE REQUEST

With the recent total loss of a relatively new SWITA bus, 2117, and ongoing demands on our system—but new buses not being manufactured at a rate sufficient to fulfill our current grant awards in a timely manner, we do need to add vehicles to our fleet by purchasing some quality used vehicles.

We anticipate receiving \$30,000-\$50,000 in insurance proceed from 2117, but that will not be known until the vehicle is released by the Iowa State Patrol.

Mark has researched and most vehicles that meet our needs and don't look like total junkers are in the \$40-\$60,000 range.

Attached are two examples of vehicles that meet our needs. Obviously, with used vehicles inventory is changing all the time. If we were to purchase these two vehicles the cost would be \$92,899. We are requesting spending authority of \$100,000 in order to purchase 2 used transit buses of similar size and quality.
